January 5, 1920 - February 15, 2010

Alice M. Brady, age 90, of Sault Ste. Marie, Michigan passed away Monday morning, February 15, 2010 at War Memorial Hospital's Long Term Care Unit. She was born in Antrim County, Michigan on January 5, 1920 to the late John and Nora (Fultz) Wells. Alice graduated from Sault High School with the class of 1937, she married Leo Nicholas Brady at the St. Mary's Catholic Church on December 2, 1939. While being a wife and mother were primary in her life and brought her great pleasure, nothing made her eyes sparkle more than when she was dancing with her husband Leo. She also enjoyed reading, sewing, baking and, especially time at their cabin/retirement home in Brimley. After the Carbide Plant closed, where her husband Leo worked they moved to Petoskey for several years before returning to the Soo upon retirement. Alice worked as a secretary/stenographer for the Corp of Engineers, Ft. Brady, Camp Lucas, Kincheloe Air Base, War Memorial Hospital, MI Employment Security, but possibly she was best known in the area as Unit manager for Stanley Home Products. In 2001, Alice moved to Tennessee for 5 years before once again returning to her home in the Soo. Alice is survived by three children: Patrick Leo (Ruth) Brady of Tennessee, Mary Coreen Brady of Sault Ste. Marie, Michigan and David James Brady of Ohio; three grandchildren: Peter (Candy) Lakanen of Florida, Shannon Lakanen of Ohio, and Kristeen Duren of Tennessee; and three great-grandchildren: Jacob Duren and Brady Duren of Tennessee and Alex Botello of Ohio. Alice was preceded in death by her parents, her husband: Leo Brady (1991); an infant daughter: Linda Noreen

Brady (1949); a brother: Fred Wells; a sister: Gladys Schaulk; and a beloved niece: Freda Bourque.
