Thomas L. Paquin, 70 of St. Ignace passed away Saturday evening, February 7 at his home on Lake Street surrounded by his family after a 2 year illness. He was born in St. Ignace on June 3, 1944 to Alex and Cornelia Theresa (Carson) Paquin. He attended the Ursuline Academy through the 8th grade and was a long time commercial fisherman, working for Dick Hagens Fish Market on State Street. He worked as a Millrite in Maryland and was a member of Union 1838. He returned to Michigan to raise a family, and lived near Cross Village several years. He has been a Native American Artist for the past 25 years, making Quill baskets, and made the Chief Wawatam for downtown St. Ignace. He also made many Totem Poles and sold them. He has been very active in the Native American Culture in St. Ignace. He is a member of Sault Tribe Chippewa Indians, and an Elder.

On July 16, 1966 he married Sally Ikens of Charlevoix, and she survives; also 2 daughters, Sherrie Marie (Mike Flynn) Paquin, Cheboygan; Tammy Joanne Anderson, Maryville, Louisiana; 2 brothers, Ron and Molly Paquin, Cheboygan; Leonard Paquin, in Toledo, Ohio; sisters, Virginia Hutck, St. Ignace; Donna Corp, Munising; and Betty Marshall, in Wisconsin and five grandchildren.; Jhonathan Searles; Thomas Paquin; Matthew Roberts; Keegan Flynn and Kalen Flynn. He was preceded in death by his brothers, Floyd and Donald Paquin.

According to his wishes cremation has taken place. No services will be held at this time. Dodson Funeral Hoime assisted with arrangements.
