Mr. Dale Harry Jarman of Sault Ste. Marie, Michigan, passed away Sunday morning at the Ball Hospice House in Sault Ste. Marie, Michigan. Mr. Jarman was born on March 22, 1942 in Riggsville, Michigan to Vernon C. and Helena M. (Wester) Jarman. He graduated from Pellston High School in 1961 and from Lake Superior State University in 1987. He served his country during the Vietnam War with the US Navy in the submarine service from 1961 to 1981, retiring as a Chief Petty Officer ETC(SS). He was a life member of the National Rifle Association. He also machine quilted approximately 1000 quilts donated to the Shriners Hospitals for children. He loved hunting and fishing with family and spending time with his grandchildren.

On October 30, 1987 he married Lola Kay Nykanen in Sault Ste. Marie, Michigan, who survives.
