Eugene Anthony Pietrangelo, 84, of Sault Ste. Marie, Michigan, passed away Monday, February 13, 2017 at War Memorial Hospital. Eugene was born June 10, 1932 in Sault Ste. Marie, Michigan to Peter and Mary Pietrangelo. He attended Loretto High School. Eugene served in Korea from 1952 to 1954, with the rank of Sergeant. He was discharged in 1954 and returned home. On May 8, 1954 he married the former Barbara Marion Albon in Sault Ste. Marie, Michigan. Eugene was employed at Kincheloe Air Force Base for eighteen years until the base closed. He then went to work in the Security Department at Lake Superior State University until he retired in 1996. Eugene was a huge Detroit Lions, Detroit Red Wings, and Detroit Tigers fan. He also loved watching Laker hockey and basketball in his spare time. Eugene is survived by his seven children. Five sons: James Pietrangelo of Flint, Michigan; Thomas (Deborah) Pietrangelo of Adrian, Michigan; Jeffrey (Debra) Pietrangelo of Marquette, Michigan; Todd (Kimberley) Pietrangelo of Sault Ste. Marie, Michigan; Paul (Hala) Pietrangelo of Shelby Township, Michigan. His two daughters Laurie (Timothy) Noe, and Linda (Kenton) Jennings both from Mesa, Arizona. He is also survived by his sister Diane (Alan) Laakso of Echo Bay, Canada, along with many brother and sisters-in-law. Eugene had fifteen grandchildren and nine great-grandchildren, along with several nieces and nephews. He was preceded in death by his parents, Peter and Mary (Dalimonte) Pietrangelo, his wife Barbara Marion (Albon) Pietrangelo, his brother Nick Pietrangelo, daughter-in-law Linda (Berra) Pietrangelo, and
