Though she was irreplaceable, he found a new travel buddy in his granddaughter Lisa who took many annual trips with him and lived with him until graduating from high school. In more recent years he also took care of his oldest son, Dan, who suffers from Multiple Sclerosis. Those who knew him will remember his cranky, sarcastic sense of humor, his love of the Chicago Cubs, his skill as a bowler and his entertaining stories.
