November 19, 1924 - October 25, 2014

Hugh Henry Cook, age 89 of Barbeau, Michigan, passed away on Saturday morning, October 25, 2014 at War Memorial Hospital. Hugh was born on November 19, 1924 in Barbeau, Michigan the son of the late Hugh A. and Ruby (Brander) Cook. Hugh enlisted in the U.S. Navy during World War II, and served on the USS Onslow, where he was a gunner. At one time, Hugh served 26 months straight on the ship without a liberty pass. After the war, Hugh married Helen Bradshaw on December 27, 1957. He was an avid fisherman, and loved hunting and anything outdoors. Hugh loved helping people, and was given a "Neighbor of the Year" award from his neighborhood. He was a member of the VFW Post #3676, the Masonic Lodge, and was part of the Iron Workers' Union. Hugh is survived by his wife: Helen Cook; a daughter: Heather Cook of Holt, MI; two granddaughters: Michaela Cook and Carlie Cook; three sisters: Mary Mara of Kalamazoo, MI, Ollie Lesyshen of Sault Ste. Marie, ONT, and Carol "Anita" (Don) Monk of Barbeau, MI; and two brothers: Ray (Linda) Cook of Sault Ste. Marie, MI, and Lynn (Pam) Cook of Florida. He is also survived by four sisters-in-law: Sylvia Cook, Raya Cook, Anne Rowsell, and Dorothy Parsons; two brothers-in-law: John Lawrence and Roger Norton; and many nieces, nephews, and cousins. Hugh was preceded in death by his son: Hugh "Brad" Cook; two brothers: Edward Cook and Art Cook; four sisters: Dorothy Lawrence, Jane Niemi, Pat Norton, and Arbutus "Jean" Paulus.
