



## Ingeborg Hornung

December 29, 1919 - May 12, 2008

Ingeborg Helen Hornung, age 88 of Bruce Township, Michigan passed away Monday morning, May 12, 2008 at her home. Inge was born in Essen, Germany on December 29, 1919 to the late Henry and Maria (Lick) Stoffel. When she was 3 years old her family moved to the U.S., settling in Detroit, MI. She attended St. Dominic School and later graduated from Nazereth College in Kalamazoo. Most of her teen years were spent in bookkeeping for her dad's painting business. When the painting business closed, Inge and her parents built a resort in Ashley, MI just north of Lansing. Here she met Anton H. Hornung and were married in St. Johns, MI on May 15, 1952. On September 20, 1955 they bought Channel View Sport Shop. The first few years, they only sold fishing supplies, but later expanded and built a motel, gas station, and a garage. Inge took care of the motel and also was Anton's bookkeeper. After 22 years they sold Channel View and built Tony's Gun Shop on 15 Mile Rd. and M-129. Inge was a good housekeeper and a wonderful cook. She liked to cook a lot of German dishes. She loved German Shepherd dogs. She was an average sewer and liked to make clothes. Inge enjoyed working in the gun shop selling merchandise, traveling, and spending winters in Florida. Inge is survived by her husband of 55 years; Anton "Tony" Hornung, son; Frank Hornung of Lima, Ohio, grandson; Jeremy Hornung of Sault Ste Marie, Michigan, granddaughter; Jessica Herring of Texas, and two great grandchildren; Jaiden and Michaela. A Memorial Mass will be held at 11:00 AM on Saturday, May 17, 2008 at Holy Family Catholic Church with Brother

John Hascall as celebrant. Friends may call at the church from 9:00 AM until the time of the service. Burial will be at Oaklawn Chapel Gardens. Memorials may be left to the Hospice of Chippewa County.
