



Juliana Victoria Traynor Krysick

January 10, 1918 - August 5, 2017

Juliana Victoria Traynor Krysick, age 99 ½, of Goetzville, Michigan, entered eternal life on August 5, 2017. She died at the home of her daughter in Petoskey, Michigan, surrounded by her family. She was born January 10, 1918, in Goetzville, to John and Mary (Mucha) Kowalczyk.

Juliana lived most of her life in Goetzville. She married John Traynor and they were blessed with three daughters, Linda, Lana, and Elizabeth “Betty”. Juliana worked as a cook for many years in various local restaurants before working at Kincheloe Air Force Base where she was the kitchen manager at the NCO Club. She retired in 1972 but remained very active in the community helping with countless dinners and other activities during the years since. Her husband, John died in 1972 and in 1975, Juliana married Edward Krysick, who died in 1986.

Juliana was an active member of St. Stanislaus Kostka Catholic Church in Goetzville.

Juliana enjoyed sewing and gardening. She also did paper tole artwork that was admired by many. She loved her children, grandchildren, and great grandchildren and enjoyed telling them bedtime stories.

Juliana is survived by her daughters, Linda (Robert) Reynolds of DeWitt,

Michigan, Lana Christy of Canton, Michigan, and Betty (Thomas) Mansfield of Petoskey, Michigan; seven grandchildren, Brian (Kathy) Christy, Lisa Christy, Dawn Dell, Theresa (Dan) Korrocks, Brad (Carrie) Reynolds, John (Virginia) Mansfield, and Dody (Bryan) Conklin; and fourteen great grandchildren. She is also survived by her sister-in-law, Lucille Kowalczyk.

Juliana was preceded in death by her first husband, John; her second husband, Edward; son-in-law, Tom Christy; granddaughter, Julie Christy; four sisters, Kathryn Desormeaux, Leona McSheffrey, Irene Zbiega, and Caroline Soczek; two brothers, John Kowalczyk and Joseph Kowalczyk; and three brothers-in-law, Eugene Desormeaux, Stanley Zbiega, and Joseph Soczek.
