Kenneth Harold Fisher, age 78, of Cedarville, Michigan, died Thursday, November 16, 2017, at Cedar Cove Assisted Living from complications of Alzheimer's disease. He was born, as he always said, the day before Groundhog Day in 1939, to Cecil and Violet (Miner) Fisher of Gould City, Michigan.

Kenny graduated from Cedarville High School, joined the Army and was stationed in Fort Benning, Georgia, for two very uneventful years. He met his wife Judy (Weston) of Cedarville at the Runway Bar in Hessel and enjoyed 40 years of marriage before her death in 2003. Kenny worked at the Kincheloe Air Force base until its closure and retired in 2004 from Carmeuse Lime and Stone Quarry in Cedarville where he enjoyed many friendships and joining in the practical jokes with his coworkers.

Kenny was a super fan of the Detroit Tigers before it was cool and rarely missed a game. He also loved the outdoors, berry picking, old westerns, going to the casino, reading Helen Shoberg's newspaper column, and classic country music.

Kenny is survived by his three sons and three daughters by marriage, Brian and Lisa (Payment) Fisher of Cedarville, Tim and Laura (Winberg) Fisher of Pickford, Michigan, and John and Sandi (Baker) Fisher of Cedarville; seven

grandchildren, Lance, Brian Jr., Nicole, Stephanie, Nathan, Chase, and Lily; and nine great grandchildren, Taylor, Anthony, Karli, Nicholas, Hunter, Brooke, Rozlynn, Isabella, and Shelby.

Kenny is preceded in death by his wife, Judy; his parents; several brothers and sisters; and his beloved Basset Hounds, Waltzing Matilda and Buster.

A private family burial at Cedar Cemetery in Cedarville is planned at Kenny's request but everyone who knew him is asked to celebrate his life in their own way, such as raising a glass of his favorite Pabst Blue Ribbon beer in memory, or doing an act of kindness for someone in his name.
