She graduated from Western Michigan University and married Donald Bump in 1969. Donald and Linda moved to Sault Ste. Marie, Michigan in 1970 where Linda began her 41 year teaching career at St. Mary's Catholic school, before going on to teach at Lincoln Elementary, where she would spend the majority of her career.
