Mollie Marie Bertram, age 93, of Sault Ste. Marie, Michigan passed away Friday afternoon, October 21, 2011 at War Memorial Hospital. Mollie was born on March 3, 1918 in Jennings, Michigan. Her family moved to Sault Ste. Marie when she was 8 years old. She married Gordon J. "Muzzy" Bertram on December 22, 1936 and they lived in Pontiac until moving to Brimley when Muzzy joined the Navy in WWII. During this time, Mollie worked as a teacher-aide with the Brimley Public School. When Muzzy returned from the war, she traveled with him to jobs he had with the Operating Engineers. After retirement, they stayed in Brimley and were very active in the community doing things like playing Mr. And Mrs. Santa Claus. A few years after Muzzy's death, Mollie moved to Freighter View Assisted Living and enjoyed living there. Mollie attended the Brimley Congregational Church and the Donaldson Presbyterian Church.
