July 11, 1925 - January 1, 2015

Nicholas Toruk, age 89, of Cedarville, Michigan, died Thursday, January 1, 2015 in St. Ignace, Michigan. He was born July 11, 1925 in Detroit, Michigan, to Nicholas and Julia (Choka) Toruk.

Nicholas grew up in Melvindale, Michigan. He served in the United States Army during World War II. Nicholas graduated from the University of Detroit and worked as an engineer for General Motors for 30 years. At age 34, Nicholas was granted a patent for the circuit controller used to manipulate power seats in automobiles. He retired to Cedarville in 1985 and built his home on property he owned since 1969.

Nicholas enjoyed boating, fishing, traveling, snowmobiling, and spending time at the casino. He owned a 46' boat that he lived on for several weeks each summer.

Nicholas is survived by his wife, Dorothy, whom he married April 9, 1983; daughters, Elizabeth (Jim) Pinkowski of Ypsilanti, Michigan, and Suzanne Toruk of Mooresville, North Carolina; and step-children, Karen Whitmore and Diane (Darryl) Hedblad of Emmett, Michigan, Kenneth (Margie) Simmons of California, and Robert (Patty) Simmons of Rockledge, Florida; grandchildren, Catherine, Michael, Kaitlyn, Danny, Matt, Stacey, Andrea, April, and Chelsea; and a great grandson, Henry.

Nicholas was preceded in death by his step-son, Ronald Simmons.

Inurnment will be in the Great Lakes National Cemetery in Holly, Michigan with full military honors.
