Scott Allen Moulton, age 62, of Eckerman, Michigan, passed unexpectedly on Saturday, February 28, 2026. He was born on May 24, 1963, in Pontiac, Michigan, to William Willard and Delores Rose (Jacobs) Moulton.

Scott grew up in Highland, Michigan, and graduated from Milford High School. After graduation, he held multiple jobs including working for Spartan Grocery and Cars & Concepts.
