Walter Nicholas Cameron, age 75, of Drummond Island, Michigan, died Sunday, August 30, 2015 in Sault Ste. Marie, Michigan. He was born April 25, 1940 in Sault Ste. Marie, to Paul Jay Cameron Sr. and Ruth Madalyn (Klassen) Cameron.

Nick, as he was known by his friends, grew up in Sault Ste. Marie, and as a boy of three years, began visiting Scott's Camp on Drummond Island with his brother, Paul Jay "PJ" and their parents and grandparents. Nick fell in love with Drummond Island. So much so that, after high school and a tour in the Navy, he moved to the island and began working at Drummond Dolomite quarry.
