



## William N. Bonner

June 6, 1927 - May 31, 1951

William N. Bonner, Corporal U.S. Army was captured by the North Koreans on November 2, 1950. Corporal Bonner was a medic with the Medical Company, 8th Cavalry Regiment, 1st Cavalry Division. He was taken prisoner while tending his wounded comrades and was held as a prisoner of war. He was unaccounted for after the war and was presumed to have been killed while in captivity in May of 1951. His unidentified remains were returned by the Koreans and were recently confirmed by DNA testing. Corporal Bonner was a surgical technician serving with the 8th Cavalry Regiment, 1st Cavalry Division in Korea. William Bonner was born June 6, 1927 in Sault Ste. Marie, Michigan the son of William Hugh Bonner and Nellie (Bye) Bonner. He was one of six siblings. Since 1951, brother, Daniel Bonner and sister, Barbara Smith have died. Sisters Ruth Schaffner, Elizabeth Golik and Beryl Cardinal all survive. Funeral services with full military honors will be held 10:00 a.m. Saturday June 28, 2014 at Clark Bailey Newhouse Funeral Home. Final resting place will be at Riverside Cemetery.
